Every Sunday we at Canon Davis Memorial Church place on the altar a basket of food items for the Inn of the Good Shepherd. This basket symbolizes our dedication to helping this important facility focused on helping those people in need.

The Inn of the Good Shepherd food bank requires not just food donations. They need almost any item you can find at your local grocery store.

You can donate almost everything, including diapers for children and adults. If someone you know has diapers left over, it doesn't have to be a full package. Women's and men's hygiene products are also appreciated.

If you are going to re-gift something you got as a present, think about giving it to the Inn. They also need clothes and eyeglasses. Think about it this way — whatever you need for daily living they need!

They also need recycle items, like glass jars to put washing soap in; coffee tins and jam jars; water bottles to put dish soap in; and egg cartons; and shopping bags, plastic or reusable. In addition ice cream cartons for baking flour and margarine tubs for rice are welcome items.

Bring your donated items to church and place them in the basket at the rear of the church. They will be taken to the The Inn on a regular basis.
